Renée is called to the Bar in three provinces: Saskatchewan (2008), Newfoundland and Labrador (2008), and in Alberta (2013). She earned a Bachelor of Commerce (Co-operative) and Bachelor of Arts (English major) both in 2002, and her Juris Doctorate of Law in 2007, studying at Memorial University of Newfoundland (including Harlow, England), the University of Saskatchewan, and University of Alberta.

Since childhood, she has been an avid volunteer. From 2018 to 2020, Renée was appointed Federal Crown Agent for Northern Alberta. From 2019 to present, she has been appointed Legal Representation Counsel for Youth through the Office of the Youth and Child Advocate representing for children within the child welfare system. In addition, she sits on specialized Legal Aid Alberta panels focusing on vulnerable youth within the criminal justice system and high-conflict family matters assisting children within the justice system. Renée is the founder of New Beginning Law in rural north-eastern Alberta.

Why do you want to serve on the CBA Alberta Board of Directors?

The rural northern areas need a voice. Policy appears to be heavily-influenced by city practice and resources, often which does not reflect realities facing clients in our rural regions. I know first-hand about specific and system issues that need to be addressed in our region, as well as how that compares to the Provinces of Saskatchewan and Newfoundland and Labrador, city and remote.

I want to continue to make a difference through the CBA, and to ensure that clients and counsel are heard, and that the respect for the protections of the law are extended to the most vulnerable. Being on CBA committees and the Board back when starting out, helped me create connections personally; however, this time in 2026, with 19 years at the Bar, I want the CBA to be connected to the issues within the pulse of our legal landscape within our region.
