

Lane Aman — Candidate for CBA Alberta Board of Directors (2026–2028) Biography



I am an associate lawyer at Hayher Lee LLP in Calgary, practicing in family law with a growing focus on appellate advocacy. Called to the Alberta bar in July 2023, I have established an independent litigation practice, appearing as sole or lead counsel in arbitration, mediation, and before all three levels of court in Alberta. My reported decisions include matters before the Alberta Court of Appeal, the Court of King's Bench, and the Court of Justice.

My connection to southern Alberta runs deep. I grew up in Medicine Hat, spent five years in Lethbridge completing my undergraduate degree at the University of Lethbridge where I played college level baseball, and then attended the University of Calgary Faculty of Law. I have family, including a young niece and nephew, in Brooks, Alberta, whom I visit regularly. From Medicine Hat to Lethbridge to Calgary, with family stops in Brooks along the way, I have a pretty good feel for southern Alberta and the communities our members serve.

I have been fortunate in my career to have the benefit of outstanding mentors who have invested in my growth as a lawyer and as a professional. That experience has shaped my deep belief that every member of the legal profession deserves access to the knowledge, skills, and ethical grounding they need to thrive. I have co-presented with LESA on appellate practice alongside senior members of the bench and bar, and I regularly seek opportunities to learn and to contribute to the development of my peers. I have also taken on pro bono work including a recently filed application for Leave to Appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada in a child support matter we are advancing on a pro bono basis with the goal of improving access to justice for shared parenting families across the country.

Outside the law, I currently coach youth baseball in Calgary on the evenings and weekends and I spent several years co-organizing a charity Slow Pitch Tournament in Medicine Hat that raised

over \$150,000 for local mental health initiatives over its lifetime. I care about the communities I grew up in and the ones I now live and work in, and I think that instinct translates well to board service.

I am running for the CBA Alberta Board because I believe in what this organization does. Improving the law, promoting access to justice, and supporting the well-being of lawyers are things I care about personally, not just professionally. I have seen the difference good mentorship and strong professional communities make early in a career, and I want to help CBA Alberta keep delivering that for the next generation of Alberta lawyers. I would be proud to represent the South as a young lawyer on the Board and to contribute whatever I can.
